



Sunday 30th September 2018



**WALK 5**  
**Grade A (15 Km)** - Skibbereen  
- Lick Hill - Gorteenalomane  
- Liss Ard - Skibbereen

Walk through town to quiet roads and then to off-road track to top of Lick Hill, back to quiet country roads at Knockataggart and Gorteenalomane to Liss Ard Estate for tea/coffee, returning by road to Skibbereen Town.

Off-road gear essential, total ascent 320 m.  
No dogs allowed.

Meet at **9.30 am Sunday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre and returning by 2.00 pm.



**WALK 6**  
**Grade B (13 km)** – Lisheen  
– Cunnamore – Hare Island - Lisheen

Walk through quiet country roads from Lisheen to Cunnamore Pier, ferry (12.00 noon) to Hare Island, explore Hare Island and return by ferry and road for tea/coffee at Minihane's Bar.

Meet at **10.30 am Sunday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre for bus transfer to Lisheen returning later from Lisheen by 5.00pm.



**WALK 7**  
**Grade C (6 km)** –  
Drimoleague Family Walk

Visit Castledonovan castle prior to walking through quiet country roads and riverside walks to Ahanafunson Bridge and finishing at Top of The Rock, Drimoleague.

Meet at **2.00 pm Sunday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre for bus transfer to Castledonovan returning later to Skibbereen by 6.00 pm.

Off-road gear essential, not suitable for buggies. No dogs allowed.

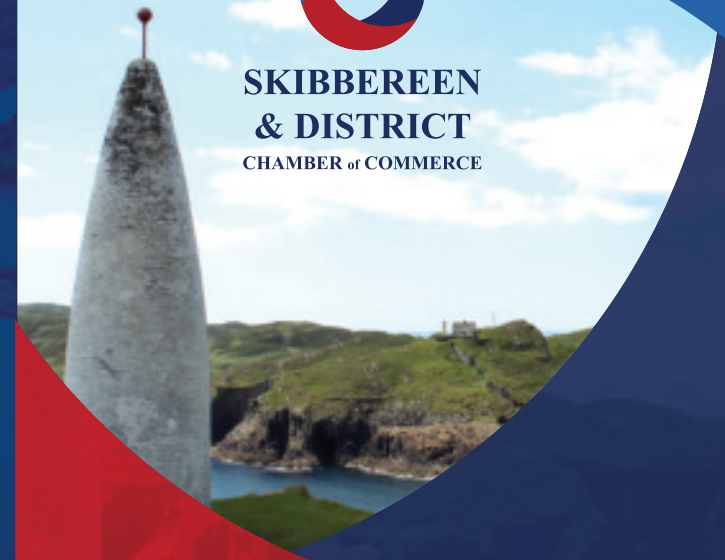

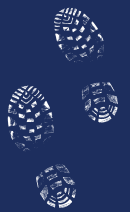

Friday 28th September 2018



**WALK 1**  
**Grade B (8.5 km)** - Union Hall  
- Squince - Myross - Union Hall

Walk through quiet country roads from Union Hall Church to Squince, passing Myross and Lough Cluhir on the way back to Union Hall.

Meet at **5.00 pm Friday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre for bus transfer to Union Hall returning later to Skibbereen by 8.30 pm



Saturday 29th September 2018



**WALK 2**  
**Grade B (7.0 Km)**  
- Long Island, Schull.

Ferry from Colla Pier to Long Island, walk on quiet country road and track from Midlands Pier to Cooper Point Lighthouse, return and continue to Westerland Pier.

Off-road gear essential. No dogs allowed.

Meet at **9.30 am Saturday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre for bus Transfer to Colla returning later to Skibbereen by 4.00 pm.



**WALK 3**  
**Grade A (11 km)** - Ballylinchy  
- Spain - Trafraska - Beacon  
- Baltimore.

Walk through quiet country road and cliff path to Spain Tower, continuing through country roads to Trafraska and following cliff paths to the Beacon before returning to Baltimore village.

Off-road gear essential. No dogs allowed.

Meet at **11.30 am Saturday** at Skibbereen Heritage Centre for bus transfer to Ballylinchy returning later to Skibbereen by 6.00 pm.



**WALK 4**  
**Grade C (5km)** - Lough Hyne  
- Knockanoulty - Barlogue  
- Lough Hyne

Join Terri Kearney from Skibbereen Heritage Centre for a walk through 4,000 years of Lough Hyne's history. This walk will cover the history, archaeology and folklore of this unique salt-water lake, taking in the Great Famine, Bronze Age artefacts and monuments, Holy Wells, coffin stones, castles, set dancing and a lot more besides

Meet at **2.00 pm Saturday** at the base of Knockomagh Hill, Lough Hyne.
